Jody Williams won the 1997 Nobel Peace Prize for her work to ban landmines around the world. As the founding coordinator of the International Campaign to Ban Landmines, she oversaw ICBL's growth to over 1,300 organizations in 95 countries working to eliminate antipersonnel landmines. She served as strategist and spokesperson for the ICBL during the Sept. 1997 diplomatic conference in Oslo where an international treaty banning antipersonnel landmines was signed.

Mairead Corrigan Maguire won the 1976 Nobel Peace Prize after her relatives were killed on the streets of Belfast, and she organized the largest peace demonstrations in the history of Northern Ireland. She co-founded the Peace People Community in Belfast, and has dedicated her life to promoting nonviolence and peace around the world. She has traveled the warzones of the world teaching peace.
